## Violence erupts in Sandeshkhali again, women scuffle with police

KOLKATA, JUNE 2 /--/ In less than 24 hours after the election was over, trouble-torn Sandeshkhali witnessed another round of skirmishes between women and the police on Sunday when the personnel went there and detained one person in connection with attacks on policemen.

Local women in Agarhati village in Sandeshkhali area got involved in a scuffle with the Rapid Action Force (RAF) personnel, fell tree trunks, and blocked roads when the police personnel reached there in search of a few persons accused of attacking them on Saturday night, a senior police officer said. "We have not arrested anyone, but local women have started protesting. Some of our female colleagues are injured. We are trying to talk to them and remove the barricades from the roads," the officer in Basirhat Police District told PTI. There was an attempt by local women to snatch the detained person, but the move was foiled, he said.

We are trying to bring the situation under control. A huge number of RAF, Quick Response Team (QRT) and policemen are present here," the officer said. Sandeshkhali a riverine delta bordering the Sundarbans has been on the boil since January 5, when a team of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) was attacked when it had gone to raid the premises of TMC strongman Shajahan Sheikh in connection with an alleged ration scam. Sheikh and his accomplices were arrested by the West Bengal Police on February 29 in connection with the attack on the ED officers.

After the attack by a mob of around 1,000 people in which three ED officials were injured, a deputy director of the agency had given a complaint to the superintendent of police, Basirhat. (PTI)

## SFI alleges saffron forces involved in religious campaign at Visva Bharati, varsity denies charge

KOLKATA, JUNE 2 /--/ Left wing Students Federation of India (SFI) has alleged "saffron forces" are holding "certain religious activities" on Visva Bharati campus with over 12 rooms allotted to one such organisation in the university guest house. Responding to the charges, Visva Bharati authorities, however, said, "no religious meet has been allowed within the university campus" but any room of the varsity-run guest house can be booked by any "bona-fide organisation as per applicable rates".

The SFI leveled the 'saffronisation' charges a day ago citing reports that the Shankaracharya of Puri Swami Nischalananda Saraswati will be attending a three-day religious event at a Bolpur auditorium and stay at a guest house at Ratanakuthi in Santiniketan. The SFI further claimed in a mail to the vice-chancellor of the central university that a couple of days ago a "mass poster" of the said religious event was spotted around the campus premises, which also includes the 'Ashram Prangana'.

"The Visva-Bharati campus is a serene place built upon the values and



ideals of Rabindranath Tagore, which are directly impeded by such activities in recent times. Visva-Bharati in order to maintain its autonomy from mainstream religion has always refrained from celebrating religious practices such as the Saraswati Puja or the Durga Puja," the left students' body said.

Denying any religious meet "has been organised or permitted at Visva-Bharati," registrar Ashok Mahato told PTI on Saturday, "I read in newspapers that Sh an k a r a c h a r y a ' s

programme is to be held at Gitanjali complex, which, as you know, is outside our campus and is not owned or managed by Visva-Bharati." About the report that the Puri seer will be staying at the university-run guest house, he said, "while I don't have the guest details with me now, it can be said the guest house can be booked against applicable rent."

"The spokesperson of Visva Bharati said, "the Visva-Bharati guest houses can be booked by any citizen of India or bona fide institution of this country through proper channel."

"The same has happened in this case. Further, the religious programme, if any, is not being held in Visva-Bharati but outside the campus," the spokesperson said. Visva Bharati University Faculty Association (VBUFA) office-bearer Kausik Bhattacharya said, "to our knowledge, the organisation which had invited the Shankaracharya of Puri is a religious body having no link with the BJP."

"But the university property should never be used for any religious activity nor should there be a campaign for any such programme on the campus which is not in sync with the ideals propagated by Tagore and his father Maharshi Debendranath Tagore, who professed the Brahma ideology," he said. An SFI member of Visva Bharati unit termed the development as attempt to "influence general students of an educational institution by outside saffron forces."

"It is also well known that the university has allotted about 12/14 rooms to the said group in the university's Ratan Kuthi guest house," he added. (PTI)

## Will win at least 12 LS seats, 110 Assembly constituencies in Odisha: BJD

BHUBANESWAR, JUNE 2 /--/ The ruling BJD on Sunday asserted that the party would form the government in Odisha with a two-thirds majority by winning at least 110 of the 147 assembly constituencies in the state.

The party said it would bag at least 12 of the 21 Lok Sabha seats in the eastern state. Rejecting exit polls that predicted that the BJP would win 15 Lok Sabha seats in Odisha, the BJD said that exit polls for the state have proved to be wrong in 2014 and 2019 elections and the trend would continue this time as well.

"We are well poised to retain power in the state with a two-thirds majority in the assembly. Like in 2014 and 2019, this time as well the

exit polls will be proved wrong," BJD spokesperson Sammit Patra said. "Based on our surveys, analysis and feedback from the ground level, we expect to win at least 12 Lok Sabha seats and 110 seats in the assembly we will form a strong and stable government in the state," he said. Exit polls have awarded 15 seats to BJP and five to BJD in Odisha. Senior BJD leader V K Pandian said in a

## Odisha confirms 9 sunstroke deaths, 81 other cases under scrutiny

BHUBANESWAR, JUNE 2 /--/ The Odisha government on Saturday confirmed the deaths of nine persons due to sunstroke so far, while the investigation into 81 more casualties suspected to be linked to heat-related illness is currently underway.

According to a report from the Office of the Special Relief Commissioner (SRC), the government has received information about 96 cases of suspected sunstroke deaths during the current summer season. Out of those, 54 suspected cases were reported from seven districts since Friday. The districts were Bolangir (20 cases), Sambalpur (15), Jharsuguda (six), Keonjhar (four), Sonapur (six), Sundargarh (two) and Balasore (one). As per the report, nine sunstroke death cases have been confirmed so far, of which three deaths were reported in the last 48 hours. During the investigation, the government also found that six deaths were not due to sunstroke.

A joint investigation is underway for the remaining 81 death cases, the report said. Meanwhile, Odisha Chief secretary Pradeep Kumar Jena and

SRC Satyabrata Sahu on Saturday took a heatwave review meeting with all district collectors except Mayurbhanj, Balasore, Bhadrak, Kendrapara, Jajpur, Jagatsinghpur, Puri and Cuttack.

The collectors have been instructed to ensure the implementation of heat wave advisories and precautionary measures issued by the SRC. They were further asked to ensure post-mortem examination of suspected sunstroke death cases for sanction of ex-gratia. This apart, a joint inquiry by the local revenue officer and the local medical officer needs to be conducted to ascertain the exact cause of the death, officials said. The situation is being monitored round the clock by the office of the SRC, they said.

A severe heatwave continued to grip many parts of the state on Saturday with mercury shot up to 46 degrees Celsius at Titlagarh. It was followed by Bargarh (45.8 deg C), Bolangir (45.5 deg C), Bhawanipatna (44.6 deg C), and Nuapada (44 deg C). Apart from these places, seven other places in Odisha recorded a day temperature of 40 deg C or above during the day. (PTI)
